With your group, craft an answer to the question, “What did Jesus do for you?” that includes both his death and resurrection.

Talk a little bit about the struggle between trying to justify ourselves (make our actions look right in the eyes of others), versus actually doing the right thing.

Justification is a courtroom term. Using our text, try to think of who would fill each character in the courtroom (ex. God = judge).
