First Lesson: Genesis 18:20-32 (NIV)

Abraham prays on the basis of what he knows about the LORD: that the LORD is a just judge, that the LORD shows mercy, and that the LORD invites us to be bold in our prayers.

20 Then the Lord said, "The outcry against Sodom and Gomorrah is so great and their sin so grievous 21 that I will go down and see if what they have done is as bad as the outcry that has reached me. If not, I will know."

22 The men turned away and went toward Sodom, but Abraham remained standing before the Lord. 23 Then Abraham approached him and said: "Will you sweep away the righteous with the wicked? 24 What if there are fifty righteous people in the city? Will you really sweep it away and not spare the place for the sake of the fifty righteous people in it? 25 Far be it from you to do such a thing—to kill the righteous with the wicked, treating the righteous and the wicked alike. Far be it from you! Will not the Judge of all the earth do right?"

26 The Lord said, "If I find fifty righteous people in the city of Sodom, I will spare the whole place for their sake."

27 Then Abraham spoke up again: "Now that I have been so bold as to speak to the Lord, though I am nothing but dust and ashes, 28 what if the number of the righteous is five less than fifty? Will you destroy the whole city for lack of five people?"

"If I find forty-five there," he said, "I will not destroy it."

29 Once again he spoke to him, "What if only forty are found there?"

He said, "For the sake of forty, I will not do it."

30 Then he said, "May the Lord not be angry, but let me speak. What if only thirty can be found there?"

He answered, "I will not do it if I find thirty there."

31 Abraham said, "Now that I have been so bold as to speak to the Lord, what if only twenty can be found there?"

He said, "For the sake of twenty, I will not destroy it."

32 Then he said, "May the Lord not be angry, but let me speak just once more. What if only ten can be found there?"

He answered, "For the sake of ten, I will not destroy it."

Second Lesson: 1 Timothy 2:1-7 (NIV)

Paul teaches us that the ultimate purpose for everything we ask is that God's will would be done.

Instructions on Worship

2 I urge, then, first of all, that petitions, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for all people— 2 for kings and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness. 3 This is good, and pleases God our Savior, 4 who wants all people to be saved and to come to a knowledge of the truth. 5 For there is one God and one mediator between God and mankind, the man Christ Jesus, 6 who gave himself as a ransom for all people. This has now been witnessed to at the proper time. 7 And for this purpose I was appointed a herald and an apostle—I am telling the truth, I am not lying—and a true and faithful teacher of the Gentiles.

Gospel: Luke 11:1-13 (NIV)

Jesus teaches us how to pray and how our Father will answer.

Jesus' Teaching on Prayer

11 One day Jesus was praying in a certain place. When he finished, one of his disciples said to him, "Lord, teach us to pray, just as John taught his disciples."

2 He said to them, "When you pray, say:

"Father,

hallowed be your name,

your kingdom come.

3 Give us each day our daily bread.

4 Forgive us our sins,


for we also forgive everyone who sins against us.

And lead us not into temptation."

5 Then Jesus said to them, "Suppose you have a friend, and you go to him at midnight and say, 'Friend, lend me three loaves of bread; 6 a friend of mine on a journey has come to me, and I have no food to offer him.' 7 And suppose the one inside answers, 'Don't bother me. The door is already locked, and my children and I are in bed. I can't get up and give you anything.' 8 I tell you, even though he will not get up and give you the bread because of friendship, yet because of your shameless audacity he will surely get up and give you as much as you need.

9 "So I say to you: Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you. 10 For everyone who asks receives; the one who seeks finds; and to the one who knocks, the door will be opened.

11 "Which of you fathers, if your son asks for a fish, will give him a snake instead? 12 Or if he asks for an egg, will give him a scorpion? 13 If you then, though you are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!"

Nicene Creed



Pastor Ryan Wolfe Biography



Pastor Wolfe grew up on a dairy farm in Colfax, WI (near Eau Claire). He attended public grade school and middle school and then attended Martin Luther Prep School in Prairie du Chien for his first two years of high school. It was there he met a pretty blond girl (a farmer's daughter no less!) from Goodhue, MN. They dating school. began in high graduating from Luther Prep School in Watertown, WI in 1997 after the WELS school amalgamation.

Pastor and Jessie continued their path to ministry at Martin Luther College in New Ulm, MN. They were married before their last year of college and both graduated in 2001. Though Jessie earned a degree in elementary education, after moving to the Milwaukee area for Pastor's seminary education, she taught in a secular childcare, preparing them both for future plans God had in store for them. From 2011 until 2022, Pastor Wolfe served at Redeemer in Mandan, ND. It was a busy ministry, with opening of preschool and childcare ministries, building of a new church and parsonage, and founding of a new mission church in Dickinson, ND 100 miles away. The Wolfes were blessed in all that time and will always hold North Dakota as a special place.

Moving to Stillwater and serving at Salem is in many ways a return home for the Wolfes. Family members live about an hour away. The landscape is dotted with familiar cedars and oaks and aspens. The Wolfes look forward to picking up old habits of hiking and camping. Fishing and hunting will be different than on the prairie, but they look forward to exploring those hobbies as well. Pastor & Jessie are both musical, singing in choirs, playing handbells and piano. Pastor plays trumpet and just started learning guitar. Pastor Wolfe is a serious nerd, with love for all things science AND science fiction. He enjoys work with and on computers, and is excited to pick up handyman and woodworking hobbies that have been dormant for a while.

The Wolfe family will be plenty busy this year. Jessie will be busy directing the preschool at Salem Lutheran in Woodbury. Caleb (17) will be a freshman at Martin Luther College. Chloe (16) will be a junior and Lydia (14) will be a freshman at Great Plains Lutheran High School in Watertown, SD. Their youngest Levi (13) will be an 8th-grader at Salem Lutheran School this fall.

The Wolfes are eager to get to know everyone at Salem and help make our church a home for every member and a hope for every visitor. Pray that God blesses Salem as we work together for Christ in all we do for each other.
