Theme: Hard Truth—Put down what you love; pick up what you loathe.

V elcome! Thank you for joining us for worship today. In our services we gather before our almighty God to receive his gifts and to offer him our worship and praise. Through God's powerful Word and sacraments he renews our faith and strengthens us to serve in joy.

- **PRAYER BEFORE WORSHIP:** Loving Savior, thank you for delivering me through another week and bringing me once again to your house for worship. Bless me through your Word and fill my heart with songs of praise. Amen.
- **THEME OF THE DAY:** It is an unavoidable hard truth. Our relationship with Jesus will put us in situations where we must decide where love for him ranks compared to love for other people and things. And Jesus is not content to be one of many important things in our life; he wants to be first. **Following Jesus will force us to let go of things we love and embrace things we would naturally loathe.** Jesus tells us up front that we must count the cost of following him. That means calculating what we might have to give up as his followers. But those calculations also include what we get through him! When we perceive the infinite blessings we find in Christ, the decisions we must make, while difficult, will be clear. Whatever we lose as we follow Jesus pales in comparison to what we gain.
- **OUR WORSHIP SERIES:** Jesus knew that when he went to Jerusalem he was going to die. With a sense of urgency, Jesus shares truths we need to hear, even if we don't want to hear them. As Jesus teaches hard truth, he reverses the normal order of things. Jesus' words contain an urgent warning: Listen! Take to heart what Jesus says! For through his Word, though it contains hard truths, God gives eternal life.



- M: If we claim to be without sin we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us.

First Reading

Deuteronomy 30:15-20

Through Moses, the Lord sets two paths before Israel: one leading to life and the other to death. Life was found in listening to God's voice.

¹⁵See, I set before you today life and prosperity, death and destruction. ¹⁶For I command you today to love the LORD your God, to walk in obedience to him, and to keep his commands, decrees and laws; then you will live and increase, and the LORD your God will bless you in the land you are entering to possess.

¹⁷But if your heart turns away and you are not obedient, and if you are drawn away to bow down to other gods and worship them, ¹⁸I declare to you this day that you will certainly be destroyed. You will not live long in the land you are crossing the Jordan to enter and possess.

¹⁹This day I call the heavens and the earth as witnesses against you that I have set before you life and death, blessings and curses. Now choose life, so that you and your children may live ²⁰and that you may love the LORD your God, listen to his voice, and hold fast to him. For the LORD is your life, and he will give you many years in the land he swore to give to your fathers, Abraham, Isaac and Jacob.



Psalm of the Day: Blessed Are They

Psalm 1A

We sing the refrains and speak the verses together.



Blessed is the one who does not walk in step with the wicked or stand in the way that sinners take or sit in the company of mockers, but whose delight is in the law of the LORD, and who meditates on his law day and night. That person is like a tree planted by streams of water, which yields its fruit in season and whose leaf does not wither whatever they do prospers. *Refrain*

Not so the wicked!

They are like chaff that the wind blows away. Therefore the wicked will not stand in the judgment, nor sinners in the assembly of the righteous. *Refrain*

For the LORD watches over the way of the righteous, but the way of the wicked leads to destruction. Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit,

as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be forever. Amen. Refrain

Second Reading

Philemon 1, 7-21

The case of the escaped slave Onesimus, returning to his owner Philemon, is a perfect example of the cost of following Jesus. Paul encourages Philemon to free Onesimus and embrace him as a brother.

¹Paul, a prisoner of Christ Jesus, and Timothy our brother, To Philemon our dear friend and fellow worker⁷Your love has given me great joy and encouragement, because you, brother, have refreshed the hearts of the Lord's people.

⁸Therefore, although in Christ I could be bold and order you to do what you ought to do, ⁹yet I prefer to appeal to you on the basis of love. It is as none other than Paul—an old man and now also a prisoner of Christ Jesus—¹⁰that I appeal to you for my son Onesimus, who became my son while I was in chains. ¹¹Formerly he was useless to you, but now he has become useful both to you and to me.

¹²I am sending him—who is my very heart—back to you. ¹³I would have liked to keep him with me so that he could take your place in helping me while I am in chains for the gospel. ¹⁴But I did not want to do anything without your consent, so that any favor you do would not seem forced but would be voluntary. ¹⁵Perhaps the reason he was separated from you for a little while was that you might have him back forever— ¹⁶no longer as a slave, but better than a slave, as a dear brother. He is very dear to me but even dearer to you, both as a fellow man and as a brother in the Lord.

¹⁷So if you consider me a partner, welcome him as you would welcome me. ¹⁸If he has done you any wrong or owes you anything, charge it to me. ¹⁹I, Paul, am writing this with my own hand. I will pay it back—not to mention that you owe me your very self. ²⁰I do wish, brother, that I may have some benefit from you in the Lord; refresh my heart in Christ. ²¹Confident of your obedience, I write to you, knowing that you will do even more than I ask.

Gospel

Luke 14:25-35

²⁵Large crowds were traveling with Jesus, and turning to them he said: ²⁶"If anyone comes to me and does not hate father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters—yes, even their own life—such a person cannot be my disciple. ²⁷And whoever does not carry their cross and follow me cannot be my disciple.

²⁸"Suppose one of you wants to build a tower. Won't you first sit down and estimate the cost to see if you have enough money to complete it? ²⁹For if you lay

the foundation and are not able to finish it, everyone who sees it will ridicule you, ³⁰saying, 'This person began to build and wasn't able to finish.'

³¹"Or suppose a king is about to go to war against another king. Won't he first sit down and consider whether he is able with ten thousand men to oppose the one coming against him with twenty thousand? ³²If he is not able, he will send a delegation while the other is still a long way off and will ask for terms of peace. ³³In the same way, those of you who do not give up everything you have cannot be my disciples.

³⁴"Salt is good, but if it loses its saltiness, how can it be made salty again? ³⁵It is fit neither for the soil nor for the manure pile; it is thrown out.

"Whoever has ears to hear, let them hear."





For All—Sunday mornings (9:15am)

The Gospel of Matthew begins with a genealogy of Jesus, a kind of list of ancestors any of us might be able to produce and share. But Jesus' human ancestry is only a part of his story. Jesus didn't just come into our world—he was sent. Our Sunday morning Bible study looks at Matthew's Gospel through the lens of Jesus as the promised Messiah. The fulfillment of God's promises to Abraham and Isaiah and Adam himself. Join us in the fellowship hall each week as we watch a portion of the Gospel on video then discuss what we saw and heard. The study will be a blessing both to long-time Bible study attenders and those new to study or new to the Christian faith itself.

For All—Tuesday mornings (10:10am)

On Tuesday mornings members dig into Paul's letter to the Romans. This letter, more than any other, lays out logically who we are as sinners and what God in grace has done to save us from that sin. The group is nearly done with the book of Romans and will begin a new topic soon, so it's the perfect time to join. This study currently meets in the church sanctuary. For Women—Every other Wednesday (9:30am beginning 9/7/22)

Every other Wednesday, women are invited to the fireside room (by the church offices) to enjoy fellowship around 9:15am and bible study with Pastor Wolfe from 9:30-10:30am. We love to see families worship together and we welcome children to sing and pray and grow with us in our services. Please note these special worship aids and helps for families:

- ★ Children's bulletins & "quiet bags" for your child's use in worship are available in the entry, just to the left of the office hallway. Ask an usher if you need help finding them.
- ★ If your child needs to be nursed or quieted for a few moments you can use our "cry room" down the hallway across from the restrooms. The service is shown live on a TV in the room.
