#### **Festival of the Reformation**

Theme: The Truth will set you free

Welcome! Thank you for joining us for worship today. In our services we gather before our almighty God to receive his gifts and to offer him our worship and praise. Through God's powerful Word and sacraments he renews our faith and strengthens us to serve in joy.

**PRAYER BEFORE WORSHIP:** Holy and Triune God, we praise you today for the truth we find in your Word alone. Fill our hearts with praise at the good news of forgiveness in Christ alone, by grace alone, through faith alone. Amen.

**THEME OF THE DAY:** We value freedom and strive to protect freedoms. But do we truly understand freedom? Freedom for many means doing what you want without control or coercion. Jesus helps us to understand true freedom: "If you hold to my teaching, you are really my disciples. Then you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free." Living without Jesus' teaching ensures that we remain slaves to sin spiritually, emotionally, and eternally.

A key principle Martin Luther established through the Reformation is *sola scriptura*, Scripture alone. Luther thought it was the answer to all of life's fundamental questions. On what basis is a belief or practice justified of rejected? Scripture alone. Who or what is the final arbiter of truth? Scripture alone. Heirs of the Reformation still bind themselves to Scripture. God's divinely inspired truth brings freedom—from slavery to sinful delusions, from the burden of guilt, and from any earthly power. This week we see that when we willingly bind ourselves to truth, Jesus keeps his promise. The truth sets us free indeed.

#### **Reformation Responses**

M: In the name of the Triune God: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen! Praise to the one and only God!

- M: It was in Eden that Satan destroyed the perfect relationship that existed between God and the crown of His creation. It was in Eden that man first sinned against God.
- C: Lord, have mercy on us. We have inherited sin. We have committed sin.
- M: It was also in Eden that God first promised a Savior. When the time was right, God acted. He sent His only-begotten Son into the world to do for His creatures what they could not do for themselves. Jesus Christ lived perfectly, died innocently, and rose again to restore unity between God and mankind. To renew the image that was lost in Eden.
- C: Glory to God in the highest, and peace to His people on earth! We shall not die but live and declare the praises of God.
- M: Satan was not finished. Throughout history, he has attacked God's people, the Church, with his wicked schemes. Through false teachers and diversions, he led many to neglect the pure Gospel. God preserved His Church, often quietly, sometimes with only a whisper. But even in the depths of darkness the light of grace flickered.. In the fourth century, as Satan attacked the deity of Christ the Church confessed:
- C: We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God.
- M: In the fifth century, as the doctrine of the Trinity was attacked, the Church confessed:
- C: Now this is the true Christian faith: We worship one God in three persons and three persons in one God, without mixing the persons or dividing the divine being. For each person -- the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit -- is distinct, but the deity of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit is one, equal in glory and coeternal in majesty.

- M: Through the centuries the battle continued. Often Satan seemed to be the victor. The Gospel seemed lost. Bibles were rare. Most people were seeking heaven by works. Yet the cry of God's people continued:
- C: Lord have mercy on us. Show us Your face, O Lord. Remove us from Satan's power.
- M: Then God raised up a man to be a messenger of the everlasting gospel. That man was Martin Luther. We do not praise him, but we praise God for him, that as his instrument God restored to His Church the good news about Jesus Christ. Luther wrote:
- C: Lord Jesus, You are my righteousness, and I am Your sin. You became what you were not and made me to be what I was not.

M: This is a service of thanksgiving on the Festival of the Reformation of the Church. Let us worship the Lord, who so graciously forgives sin and so wonderfully protects his children on earth!

#### **CONFESSION & FORGIVENESS OF SINS**

From Luther's Small Catechism

- P: Confession has two parts. The one is that we confess our sins; the other, that we receive absolution or forgiveness from the pastor as from God himself, not doubting but firmly believing that our sins are thus forgiven before God in heaven. Let us confess our sins:
- C: Father, I have sinned against you and am no longer worthy to be called your child. Yet in mercy you sacrificed your only Son to purge away my guilt. For his sake, O God, be merciful to me, a sinner, and in the joy of your Holy Spirit let me serve you all my days.
- P: By the authority of Christ, I forgive you your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C: Amen.

#### First Reading

Jeremiah 31:31-34

The old covenant of law could tell people how to act but could not create the desire to freely do so. The new covenant of grace transforms people's hearts so they freely and joyfully follow God's will.

31"The days are coming," declares the LORD,
"when I will make a new covenant
with the people of Israel and with the people of Judah.

32 It will not be like the covenant I made with their ancestors
when I took them by the hand to lead them out of Egypt,
because they broke my covenant, though I was a husband to them,"

declares the LORD.

<sup>33</sup>"This is the covenant I will make with the people of Israel after that time," declares the LORD.

"I will put my law in their minds and write it on their hearts.

I will be their God, and they will be my people.

<sup>34</sup>No longer will they teach their neighbor, or say to one another, 'Know the LORD,' because they will all know me,

from the least of them to the greatest," declares the LORD.

"For I will forgive their wickedness and will remember their sins no more."

#### **Second Reading**

Galatians 5:1-6

The Apostle Paul urges us to stand firm in the freedom that we have in Christ.

<sup>1</sup>It is for freedom that Christ has set us free. Stand firm, then, and do not let yourselves be burdened again by a yoke of slavery.

<sup>2</sup>Mark my words! I, Paul, tell you that if you let yourselves be circumcised, Christ will be of no value to you at all. <sup>3</sup>Again I declare to every man who lets himself be circumcised that he is obligated to obey the whole law. <sup>4</sup>You who are trying to be justified by the law have been alienated from Christ; you have fallen away from

grace. <sup>5</sup>For through the Spirit we eagerly await by faith the righteousness for which we hope. <sup>6</sup>For in Christ Jesus neither circumcision nor uncircumcision has any value. The only thing that counts is faith expressing itself through love.

C: Thanks be to God.

The truth of the Gospel sets us free!

<sup>31</sup>To the Jews who had believed him, Jesus said, "If you hold to my teaching, you are really my disciples. <sup>32</sup>Then you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free."

<sup>33</sup>They answered him, "We are Abraham's descendants and have never been slaves of anyone. How can you say that we shall be set free?"

<sup>34</sup>Jesus replied, "Very truly I tell you, everyone who sins is a slave to sin. <sup>35</sup>Now a slave has no permanent place in the family, but a son belongs to it forever. <sup>36</sup>So if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed.

#### **Confession of Faith**

The Second Article of the Apostles' Creed, and Luther's explanation

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day he rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of God the Father Almighty. From there he will come to judge the living and the dead.

#### What does this mean?

I believe that Jesus Christ, true God, begotten of the Father from eternity, and also true man, born of the Virgin Mary, is my Lord.

He has redeemed me, a lost and condemned creature, purchased and won me from all sins, from death, and from the power of the devil, not with gold or silver but with his holy, precious blood and with his innocent suffering and death.

All this he did that I should be his own, and live under him in his kingdom, and serve him in everlasting righteousness, innocence, and blessedness, just as he has risen from death and lives and rules eternally.

This is most certainly true.
