The Church God Wants— A Church That Takes Up Its Crosses

elcome! Thank you for joining us for worship today. In our services we gather before our almighty God to receive his gifts and to offer him our worship and praise. Through God's powerful Word and sacraments he renews our faith and strengthens us to serve in joy.

- **PRAYER BEFORE WORSHIP:** Loving Shepherd, thank you for your care and guidance in the last week. Help me find peace and rest in your word and fill my praise with joy and gladness at the good news of your forgiveness. Amen.
- **THEME OF THE DAY:** Some churches teach that God blesses the faithful with worldly prosperity and peace. Jesus tells us today that as his disciples, we will have to bear crosses. These crosses can be spiritual weights on our souls or any number of physical problems. As members of Christ's church, our lives will be full of trouble and suffering. Why bother?

We carry our crosses in gratitude for Jesus carrying his cross - the one weighted down with our sin. We carry our crosses because we know that in those moments of struggle, we are forced to turn to Christ and rely on his strength. The church takes up its cross because we walk with Christ. First the cross, then the crown.

OUR WORSHIP SERIES: "I want a church that..." Every individual would complete that sentence with their own interests, priorities, and preferences. What do you want in a church? In this worship series, we see the problem inherent in that question. Jesus bought the Church with his blood - it belongs to Him. So the right question then is "what does God want in a church?" In these five weeks we see that what God wants in a healthy church might be a little different than many manmade lists. It's not about the outside or the activities it's about the heart and about the Word. The rest is just details.





CONFESSION & FORGIVENESS OF SINS



First Reading

Jeremiah 15:15-21

When the prophet Jeremiah grew tired of carrying his cross and complained, the LORD called on him to repent and promised salvation to his faithful servant.

¹⁵LORD, you understand; remember me and care for me. Avenge me on my persecutors.
You are long-suffering—do not take me away; think of how I suffer reproach for your sake.
¹⁶When your words came, I ate them; they were my joy and my heart's delight, for I bear your name, LORD God Almighty. ¹⁷I never sat in the company of revelers, never made merry with them; I sat alone because your hand was on me and you had filled me with indignation. ¹⁸Why is my pain unending and my wound grievous and incurable? You are to me like a deceptive brook. like a spring that fails. ¹⁹Therefore this is what the LORD says: "If you repent, I will restore you that you may serve me; if you utter worthy, not worthless, words, you will be my spokesman. Let this people turn to you, but you must not turn to them. ²⁰I will make you a wall to this people, a fortified wall of bronze; they will fight against you but will not overcome you, for I am with you to rescue and save vou." declares the LORD. ²¹"I will save you from the hands of the wicked and deliver you from the grasp of the cruel."

Second Reading

Romans 8:18-25

St. Paul teaches God's Church that no cross can compare with the crown of glory that is waiting.

¹⁸I consider that our present sufferings are not worth comparing with the glory that will be revealed in us. ¹⁹For the creation waits in eager expectation for the children of God to be revealed. ²⁰For the creation was subjected to frustration, not by its own choice, but by the will of the one who subjected it, in hope ²¹that the creation itself will be liberated from its bondage to decay and brought into the freedom and glory of the children of God.

²²We know that the whole creation has been groaning as in the pains of childbirth right up to the present time. ²³Not only so, but we ourselves, who have the firstfruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly as we wait eagerly for our adoption to sonship, the redemption of our bodies. ²⁴For in this hope we were saved. But hope that is seen is no hope at all. Who hopes for what they already have? ²⁵But if we hope for what we do not yet have, we wait for it patiently.

Gospel

Matthew 16:21-26

Jesus calls his Church to walk in his path: first comes the cross, then comes the crown.

²¹From that time on Jesus began to explain to his disciples that he must go to Jerusalem and suffer many things at the hands of the elders, the chief priests and the teachers of the law, and that he must be killed and on the third day be raised to life.

²²Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. "Never, Lord!" he said. "This shall never happen to you!"

²³Jesus turned and said to Peter, "Get behind me, Satan! You are a stumbling block to me; you do not have in mind the concerns of God, but merely human concerns."

²⁴Then Jesus said to his disciples, "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. ²⁵For whoever wants to save their life will lose it, but whoever loses their life for me will find it. ²⁶What good will it be for someone to gain the whole world, yet forfeit their soul? Or what can anyone give in exchange for their soul?
