Third Sunday In Advent

The King Shall Come— He is Bringing Perfect Joy

Welcome! Thank you for joining us for worship today. In our services we gather before our almighty God to receive his gifts and to offer him our worship and praise. Through God's powerful Word and sacraments he renews our faith and strengthens us to serve in joy.

PRAYER BEFORE WORSHIP: God of Majesty, thank you for your loving protection and blessings this past week. Fill me today with joy in the news of your grace and mercy, and lead me to respond in prayer and praise. Amen.

THEME OF THE DAY: The historic Christian Church gave Latin titles to each Sunday. They titled the Third Sunday in Advent "Gaudete," which means "Rejoice!" As we reach the midway point of Advent, we remember that when the King shall come, he will bring us perfect and everlasting joy. Joy is not the same thing as happiness. Happiness is an emotion. Joyfulness is a condition. Happiness comes from your circumstances. Joyfulness comes from your King entering into your heart and assuring you of his abiding love and your glorious future. Therefore, happiness is fleeting. Joyfulness is enduring.

OUR WORSHIP SERIES: The Church Year begins with the season of Advent, a word which means "coming." The greater the guest to our home, the greater the preparations are. In this worship series, we are reminded that the one who is coming to us is King over all. We see why the King came on that first Christmas and why he will come again on Judgment Day. We cherish the way our King comes to us today in Word and sacrament, establishing his reign in our hearts already now.

THE ADVENT WREATH: Christians in Europe adapted winter evergreen traditions to the themes of the Advent season centuries ago. Four candles adorn the modern wreath. The candles symbolize God's gifts of hope, peace, joy, and love. Each week in Advent we light a new candle, leading up to Christmas when we light the central white candle to remember God's greatest gift—Christ himself.



He has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim freedom for the captives and release from darkness for the prisoners, ²to proclaim the year of the LORD's favor and the day of vengeance of our God, to comfort all who mourn, ³and provide for those who grieve in Zion to bestow on them a crown of beauty instead of ashes, the oil of joy instead of mourning, and a garment of praise instead of a spirit of despair. They will be called oaks of righteousness, a planting of the LORD for the display of his splendor.

10 I delight greatly in the LORD; my soul rejoices in my God.
 For he has clothed me with garments of salvation and arrayed me in a robe of his righteousness, as a bridegroom adorns his head like a priest, and as a bride adorns herself with her jewels.

 6 There was a man sent from God whose name was John. 7 He came as a witness to testify concerning that light, so that through him all might believe. 8 He himself was not the light; he came only as a witness to the light.

¹⁹Now this was John's testimony when the Jewish leaders in Jerusalem sent priests and Levites to ask him who he was. ²⁰He did not fail to confess, but confessed freely, "I am not the Messiah."

²¹They asked him, "Then who are you? Are you Elijah?"

He said, "I am not."

"Are you the Prophet?"

He answered, "No."

²²Finally they said, "Who are you? Give us an answer to take back to those who sent us. What do you say about yourself?"

²³John replied in the words of Isaiah the prophet, "I am the voice of one calling in the wilderness, 'Make straight the way for the Lord.'"

²⁴Now the Pharisees who had been sent ²⁵questioned him, "Why then do you baptize if you are not the Messiah, nor Elijah, nor the Prophet?"

²⁶"I baptize with water," John replied, "but among you stands one you do not know. ²⁷He is the one who comes after me, the straps of whose sandals I am not worthy to untie."


²⁸This all happened at Bethany on the other side of the Jordan, where John was baptizing.

M: Come quickly, Lord Jesus, in your grace, in your power, and in your glory.




