Christmas Day Festival

Theme: Good News of Great Joy— God Became Man!

Welcome! Thank you for joining us for worship today. In our services we gather before our almighty God to receive his gifts and to offer him our worship and praise. Through God's powerful Word and sacraments he renews our faith and strengthens us to serve in joy.

PRAYER BEFORE WORSHIP: Father in heaven, thank you for sending your Son into the world to bring us life and light. Bless our hymns and prayers on this festival day that we might give you glory, honor, and praise. In Jesus' name, Amen.

THEME OF THE DAY: This day is known as the "Festival of the Nativity." Nativus is Latin for "birth." No one knows the calendar date on which our Savior was born, but by the fourth century, the Christian Church had set December 25th as the day to celebrate the birth of Christ. The birth of our Savior at Christmas and the Resurrection of our Savior at Easter mark the two greatest celebrations in the Church Year. For centuries the Festival of the Nativity has included celebration of the Lord's Supper. This is seen in the word Christmas, which is simply short for "Christ's Mass."

A WORD ABOUT HOLY COMMUNION: Our church observes the biblical practice of member communion (also called close communion). In Holy Communion we not only receive forgiveness from God, but we also express the unique relationship our members have with each other. If you are not a member of our congregation, we kindly ask that you not take communion today, but speak with our pastor after the service. We would love to share the sacrament with you in the future.

OPPORTUNITIES FOR WORSHIP THIS CHRISTMAS: The "Twelve Days of Christmas" describe the whole Christmas season, beginning Christmas Day through the festival of Epiphany on January 6th. Join us for these continuing Christmas worship opportunities!

Pre-Service Christmas Carols

Minister: Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is Christ the Lord.

Congregation: Sing to the Lord a new song, for he has done marvelous things. All the ends of the earth have seen the salvation of our God.

OPENING RESPONSES & CONFESSION OF SINS

- M: By right, we should have nothing to sing about. We do not deserve God's love. He created humankind in his perfect image to live with him in peace forever. But Adam and Eve sinned against him, and we have sinned against him no less than they have.
- C: We confess our sins, O Lord.
- M: We are embarrassed to think of our sins here. Our hearts are filled with love for you, but we confess we have often loved others more than you. Our eyes behold your glory, but we confess we have lusted for what you forbid. Our lips praise you, but we confess we have spoken evil again and again.
- C: We deplore our sins, O Lord.
- M: They have only gained us trouble. They have not given us the happiness they promised.
- C: For the sake of Jesus, forgive us for sinning against you, O Lord.
- M: Remind us that Christ came into the world to free us from the guilt of sin. Proclaim to us that his life and death cover our sins. Keep us from being attracted to sin. Spare us from being enslaved by sin. Help us make up for the sins we commit against one another.
- C: Deliver us from sin's power, O Lord.
- M: Glory to God in the highest! In love that astounds us, the eternal God sent his one and only Son to live among us, to obey as we could not, and to suffer what we deserved. In Christ there is indeed peace on earth. In him God extends his good will to all people. Because of Christ and by his authority, I say to you what God has already proclaimed: In Christ your sins are forgiven!
- C: Glory to God in the highest! Amen.




A "Te Deum Laudamus" for Christmas Day

Since the 6th century A.D. Christians have adored Christ in a song of praise and confession entitled Te Deum Laudamus (We Praise You, O God). After the minister speaks the words of the majestic song, the congregation sings Christmas hymns that reflect the song's teachings and exultation.

M: We praise you. O God, we acclaim you as Lord; all creation worships you, Father everlasting.



M: To all angels, all the powers of heaven, cherubim and seraphim, sing in endless praise: Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of heavenly hosts, heaven and earth are full of your glory.



Death

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


M: When you became man to set us free, you humbled yourself to be born of a virgin. You overcame the sting of death and opened the kingdom of heaven to all believers.

THE WORD OF GOD

First Reading

Micah 5:2-5a

Bethlehem was a little town. Yet, it will be known throughout history as the birthplace of the God-man.

²"But you, Bethlehem Ephrathah, though you are small among the clans of Judah, out of you will come for me one who will be ruler over Israel, whose origins are from of old, from ancient times."

³Therefore Israel will be abandoned until the time when she who is in labor bears a son, and the rest of his brothers return to join the Israelites.

⁴He will stand and shepherd his flock in the strength of the LORD, in the majesty of the name of the LORD his God.

And they will live securely, for then his greatness will reach to the ends of the earth.

M: The Word of the Lord.

⁵And he will be our peace.

The Son of God was born of a woman so that he might redeem us and make us heirs of the heavenly Father.

⁴But when the set time had fully come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law, ⁵to redeem those under the law, that we might receive adoption to sonship. ⁶Because you are his sons, God sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, the Spirit who calls out, "Abba, Father." ⁷So you are no longer a slave, but God's child; and since you are his child, God has made you also an heir.

Gospel Reading

John 1:1-18

The mystery of the incarnation—God became man; the Word became flesh.

¹In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ²He was with God in the beginning. ³Through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made. ⁴In him was life, and that life was the light of all mankind. ⁵The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.

⁶There was a man sent from God whose name was John. ⁷He came as a witness to testify concerning that light, so that through him all might believe. ⁸He himself was not the light; he came only as a witness to the light.

⁹The true light that gives light to everyone was coming into the world. ¹⁰He was in the world, and though the world was made through him, the world did not recognize him. ¹¹He came to that which was his own, but his own did not receive him. ¹²Yet to all who did receive him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God— ¹³children born not of natural descent, nor of human decision or a husband's will, but born of God.

¹⁴The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the one and only Son, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth.

¹⁵(John testified concerning him. He cried out, saying, "This is the one I spoke about when I said, 'He who comes after me has surpassed me because he was before me.' ") ¹⁶Out of his fullness we have all received grace in place of grace already given. ¹⁷For the law was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. ¹⁸No one has ever seen God, but the one and only Son, who is himself God and is in closest relationship with the Father, has made him known.

HAZDAYS HRISTMASK

We thank you for joining us this evening, and hope you can join us again sometime this holiday season. You are probably familiar with the song *The Twelve Days of Christmas*. It is aptly named. The early Christian church would celebrate Christmas for twelve days. The Season of Christmas begins on December 25th with the great Festival of the Nativity. On January 6th, the Festival of Epiphany brings the season of Christmas to an end.

Good News of Great Joy—God Became Man

In a celebratory service we ponder some of the most profound words in Scripture, teaching us the meaning of this baby in the manger. On Christmas day we marvel at the incarnation of Christ, the miracle of God taking on flesh to save mankind. Worship includes the celebration of Holy Communion for our members. All are invited to join us 15 minutes before the service to join in singing some of our favorite Christmas carols.

Weekend of December 31st (Regular service times)

Good News of Great Joy—Peace on Earth

The angels sang to the shepherds a song of peace between God and men. The Son of God was born! In our service on this first Sunday after Christmas we remember that Jesus' perfect life as the true Son of God was lived so that we could be adopted into God's family ourselves. Weekend of January 7th (Regular service times)

Good News of Great Joy— For All People

The season of Christmas ends on January 6th, known as Epiphany, "the Gentile Christmas." On Sunday morning, January 7th we'll consider the way God guided the wise men to Jesus and made it clear that salvation in Jesus is for us Gentiles too.

PERSONAL PREPARATION FOR HOLY COMMUNION

(Also printed in the hymnal)

- Q: What does God tell me about myself in his holy Word?
- A: He says that I am a sinner and deserve only his punishment.
- Q: What should I do if I am not aware of my sins or am not troubled by them?
- A: I should examine myself according to the Ten Commandments and ask how well I have carried out my responsibilities as a husband or wife or single person, as a parent or child, an employer or employee, a teacher or student. Have I loved God with all my heart, gladly heard his Word, and patiently endured affliction? Have I been disobedient, proud, or unforgiving? Have I been selfish, lazy, envious, or quarrelsome? Have I lied or deceived, taken something not mine, or given anyone a bad name? Have I abused my body or permitted indecent thoughts to linger in my mind? Have I failed to do what is right and good?
- Q: When I realize that I have sinned against God and deserve his punishment, what should I do?
- A: I will confess before God all my sins, those which I remember as well as those of which I am unaware. I will pray to God for his mercy and forgiveness.
- Q: How do I receive his gracious forgiveness?
- A: His Word assures me that Jesus led a pure and holy life for me and died on the cross for me to pay the full price for all my sins. Through faith in Jesus, I have been clothed in my Savior's perfect righteousness and holiness.
- Q: What further assurance do I have that Jesus is mine and I am his?
- A: In Holy Communion he gives me his body and blood together with the bread and wine as a truly life-giving food and drink to unite me with him and my fellow believers. By means of this sacrament, Jesus not only forgives my sins but sweeps away all my doubts about his love for me, gives me his own strength to live a God-pleasing life, and grants me a joyful foretaste of heaven.
- Q: How can I be sure that I receive all these blessings in the Lord's Supper?
- A: I have his own word spoken as his last will and testament on the night before he died. There he tells me: "Take and eat; this is my body. Drink from it, all of you; this is my blood which is poured out for you for the forgiveness of sins. Do this in remembrance of me."
- Q: How will I respond to this priceless gift from Jesus?
- A: I will daily thank and praise him for his love to me. With his help I will fight temptation, do my best to correct whatever wrongs I have done, and serve him and those around me with love and good works.

Lord Jesus, with joy and gratitude I now come to your table to receive the precious food of your life-giving body and blood. May it strengthen me to remain in you as you remain in me, so that I bear much fruit in devoted service to you and in acts of kindness to others. Amen.

Welcome to Worship

For our guests

- Our services are streamed live on our YouTube channel. If you would prefer not to be on camera, please sit in the seats located beneath the balcony.

For those with young children

We love to see families worship together and we welcome children to sing, pray, and grow with us in our services.

We provide a few special worship aids and helps for families:

- Children's bulletins & activity bags are available in the entry, just to the left of the office hallway. Ask an usher if you need help finding them.
- If you or your child needs a quiet space, you can use the fireside room down the hallway across from the restrooms. The service is streamed live on a TV in the room.
- → On Sunday mornings, children of all ages are invited to come to the front of church for the children's message. Parents are welcome too!
