

## THE PASSION HISTORY OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST

## Part #4— On Trial Before Pilate

**PASTOR:** The Jews led Jesus from Caiaphas to the palace of the Roman governor, Pontius Pilate. By now it was early morning, and to avoid ceremonial uncleanness the Jews did not enter the palace. They wanted to be able to eat the Passover. So Pilate came out to them and asked, "What charges are you bringing against this man?" They replied,

# <u>CONGREGATION</u>: "If he were not a criminal, we would not have handed him over to you."

**PASTOR:** Pilate said, "Take him yourselves and judge him by your own law." The Jews objected,

CONGREGATION: "But we have no right to execute anyone."

**PASTOR:** This happened so that the words Jesus had spoken indicating the kind of death he was going to die would be fulfilled. Then the chief priests and elders began to accuse him, saying,

# <u>CONGREGATION</u>: "We have found this man subverting our nation. He opposes payment of taxes to Caesar and claims to be Christ, a king."

**PASTOR:** Pilate then went back inside the palace, summoned Jesus, and asked him, "Are you the king of the Jews?"

Jesus asked, "Is that your idea, or did others talk to you about me?"

Pilate replied, "Am I a Jew? It was your people and your chief priests who handed you over to me. What is it you have done?"

Jesus said, "My kingdom is not of this world. If it were, my servants would fight to prevent my arrest by the Jews. But now my kingdom is from another place."

"You are a king, then!" said Pilate.

Jesus answered, "You are right in saying I am a king. In fact, for this reason I was born, and for this I came into the world, to testify to the truth. Everyone on the side of truth listens to me."

"What is truth?" Pilate asked. With this he went out to the Jews, and announced to the chief priests and the crowd, "I find no basis for a charge against this man." The Jews insisted,

## <u>CONGREGATION</u>: "We have a law, and according to that law he must die, because he claimed to be the Son of God."

**PASTOR:** When Pilate heard this, he was even more afraid, and he went back inside the palace. "Where do you come from?" he asked Jesus, but Jesus gave him no answer. "Do you refuse to speak to me?" Pilate said. "Don't you realize I have power either to free you or to crucify you?"

Jesus answered, "You would have no power over me if it were not given to you from above. Therefore the one who handed me over to you is guilty of a greater sin."

PASTOR: From then on, Pilate tried to set Jesus free. But the Jews insisted,

<u>CONGREGATION</u>: "He stirs up the people all over Judea by his teaching. He started in Galilee and has come all the way here."

**PASTOR:** On hearing this, Pilate asked if the man was a Galilean. When he learned that Jesus was under Herod's jurisdiction, he sent him to Herod, who was also in Jerusalem at that time.

When Herod saw Jesus, he was greatly pleased, because for a long time he had been wanting to see him perform some miracle. He plied him with many questions, but Jesus gave him no answer. The chief priests and the teachers of the law were standing there, vehemently accusing him. Then Herod and his soldiers ridiculed and mocked him. Dressing him in an elegant robe, they sent him back to Pilate.

# <u>CONGREGATION</u>: That day Herod and Pilate became friends - before this they had been enemies.

**PASTOR:** Pilate called together the chief priests, the rulers and the people, and said to them, "You brought me this man as one who was inciting the people to rebellion. I have examined him in your presence and have found no basis for your charges against him. Neither has Herod, for he sent him back to us. As you can see, he has done nothing to deserve death. Therefore, I will punish him and then release him."

#### <u>MEN</u>: Now it was the governor's custom at the Feast to release a prisoner chosen by the crowd. At that time they had a notorious prisoner, called Barabbas.

**PASTOR:** So when the crowd had gathered, Pilate asked them, "It is your custom for me to release to you one prisoner at the time of the Passover. Which one do you want me to release to you? Barabbas, or Jesus who is called Christ?" For he knew it was out of envy that they had handed Jesus over to him.

While Pilate was sitting on the judge's seat, his wife sent him this message:

# <u>WOMEN</u>: "Don't have anything to do with that innocent man, for I have suffered a great deal today in a dream because of him."

**PASTOR:** But the chief priests and the elders stirred up the crowd and persuaded them to ask for Barabbas and to have Jesus executed.

#### Sermon Text

Matthew 26:57-75

<sup>57</sup>Those who had arrested Jesus took him to Caiaphas the high priest, where the teachers of the law and the elders had assembled. <sup>58</sup>But Peter followed him at a distance, right up to the courtyard of the high priest. He entered and sat down with the guards to see the outcome.

<sup>59</sup>The chief priests and the whole Sanhedrin were looking for false evidence against Jesus so that they could put him to death. <sup>60</sup>But they did not find any, though many false witnesses came forward.

Finally two came forward <sup>61</sup>and declared, "This fellow said, 'I am able to destroy the temple of God and rebuild it in three days.'"

<sup>62</sup>Then the high priest stood up and said to Jesus, "Are you not going to answer? What is this testimony that these men are bringing against you?"
<sup>63</sup>But Jesus remained silent.

The high priest said to him, "I charge you under oath by the living God: Tell us if you are the Messiah, the Son of God."

<sup>64</sup>"You have said so," Jesus replied. "But I say to all of you: From now on you will see the Son of Man sitting at the right hand of the Mighty One and coming on the clouds of heaven."

<sup>65</sup>Then the high priest tore his clothes and said, "He has spoken blasphemy! Why do we need any more witnesses? Look, now you have heard the blasphemy. <sup>66</sup>What do you think?"

"He is worthy of death," they answered. <sup>67</sup>Then they spit in his face and struck him with their fists. Others slapped him <sup>68</sup>and said, "Prophesy to us, Messiah. Who hit you?"

<sup>69</sup>Now Peter was sitting out in the courtyard, and a servant girl came to him. "You also were with Jesus of Galilee," she said. <sup>70</sup>But he denied it before them all. "I don't know what you're talking about," he said.

<sup>71</sup>Then he went out to the gateway, where another servant girl saw him and said to the people there, "This fellow was with Jesus of Nazareth."

<sup>72</sup>He denied it again, with an oath: "I don't know the man!"

<sup>73</sup>After a little while, those standing there went up to Peter and said, "Surely you are one of them; your accent gives you away."

<sup>74</sup>Then he began to call down curses, and he swore to them, "I don't know the man!" Immediately a rooster crowed. <sup>75</sup>Then Peter remembered the word Jesus had spoken: "Before the rooster crows, you will disown me three times." And he went outside and wept bitterly.
