Resurrection Reality: All will be made alive

Welcome! Thank you for joining us for worship today. In our services we gather before our almighty God to receive his gifts and to offer him our worship and praise. Through God's powerful Word and sacraments he renews our faith and strengthens us to serve in joy.

THEME OF THE DAY: Studies have shown that most people fear death to some degree. One of the biggest reasons people fear death is the perception of its permanency. Today, Christ proves to us that death is not final at all! Just as Christ rose, "so in Christ all will be made alive" (1 Corinthians 15:22). That changes everything: the way we grieve the death of a Christian loved one. The way we feel when our health fails. The way we look at the purpose of life right now. Let us rejoice in this resurrection reality: All will be made alive!

Our Worship Series: St. Paul writes, "Christ has indeed been raised from the dead" (1 Corinthians 15:20). Since Christ has indeed been raised from the dead, we know the reality of his identity and victory and we know the reality of his promise. Jesus' resurrection proves that "all will be made alive" (1 Corinthians 15:22). Jesus' resurrection brings eternal life and eternal hope. The reality of the resurrection does not just change our future, but the way we look at life now. In this glorious season, let us meditate upon the breath-taking implications of the resurrection reality.

A WORD ABOUT HOLY COMMUNION: Our church observes the biblical practice of member communion (also called close communion). In Holy Communion we not only receive forgiveness from God but we also express the unique relationship our members have with each other. If you are not a member of our congregation, we kindly ask that you not take communion today, but speak with our pastor after the service. We would love to share the sacrament with you in the future.

THE PASCHAL CANDLE AT EASTER: This candle symbolizes Christ, the Light of the World. Its size symbolizes the mighty Victor over death and sin. Usually located at the Baptismal font, it is lighted at every baptism, for "we are buried with Him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life." (Romans 6:4) It is also lit for Christian funerals to show the close connection between Christ's resurrection and the Christian's resurrection to life eternal.

Order of Worship



Easter Acclamation

M: In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

M: Christ is risen!

C: He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

M: Where, O death, is your victory?

C: Where, O death, is your sting?

M: Since Christ was raised from the dead, he cannot die again.

C: Death no longer has mastery over him.

M: Our Savior has promised us, "Because I live, you also will live."

C: Thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ!

ALL: Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Let us worship him!

Hymn: The Day of Resurrection

The congregation sings with handbells and choir. Follow the directors to know when to sing each stanza.

All Sing: The day of resurrection! Earth, tell it out abroad, the Passover of gladness, the Passover of God.

From death to life eternal, from sin's dominion free, our Christ has brought us over with hymns of victory.

Women: Now let the heav'ns be joyful, let earth her song begin, Let all the world keep triumph And all that is therein.

Men: Let all things, seen and unseen, Their notes of gladness blend; For Christ the Lord has risen, Our joy that has no end.

All Sing: Then praise we God the Father, And praise we Christ the Son,
With them the Holy Spirit, Eternal Three in One;
Till all the ransomed number Fall down before the throne,
And honor, pow'r, and glory Ascribe to God alone!

CONFESSION & FORGIVENESS OF SINS

M: Our Savior Jesus Christ commanded Baptism when he said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

All of us are born into this world with a deep need for Baptism. From our parents we inherit a sinful nature; we are without true fear of God and true faith in God and are condemned to eternal death. But while we were still sinners, Christ died for us. He took away our sin by giving his life on the cross. In Baptism, he clothes us with the robe of his righteousness and gives us a new life. We recall what Baptism means for our daily lives:

C: Baptism means that the sinful nature in us should be drowned by daily sorrow and repentance, and that all its evil deeds and desires be put to death. It also means that a new person should daily arise to live before God in right-eousness and purity forever.

M: As baptized children of God, we confess our sins:

C: Holy God, gracious Father, I am sinful by nature

and have sinned against you in my thoughts, words, and actions.

I have not loved you with my whole heart;

I have not loved others as I should.

I deserve your punishment both now and forever.

But Jesus, my Savior, paid for my sins

with his innocent suffering and death.

Trusting in him, I pray: God, have mercy on me, a sinner.

M: God saved us through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit and united us to the death and resurrection of Jesus. Every day God forgives your sins, removes your guilt, and strengthens you to defeat Satan's power. His promise is for you and your children, and he will never forsake you. Your sins are forgiven. You are clothed with Christ. You are at peace with God now and forever.

C: Amen.

The Rite of Baptism continues at the font at the 9am service.

(9am) Sacrament of Baptism

M: The Gospel according to St. Mark: "People were bringing little children to Jesus for him to place his hands on them, but the disciples rebuked them. When Jesus saw this, he was indignant. He said to them, "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these. Truly I tell you, anyone who will not receive the kingdom of God like a little child will never enter it." And he took the children in his arms, placed his hands on them and blessed them."

The minister applies water to the person presented for baptism as he says:

M: Axtyn Barrett Stewart, I baptize you in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Receive the sign of the cross on the head and heart + to mark you as one redeemed by Christ the crucified.

The almighty God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ has given you the new birth of water and the Spirit and has forgiven all your sins. May he strengthen you with his grace all the days of your life. Peace be with you.

(9am) Exhortation to Parents & Congregation

M: Brothers and sisters in Christ:


Our Lord commands that we teach his precious truths to all who are baptized. Christian love therefore urges all of us, especially parents and sponsors, to assist in whatever manner possible so that Axtyn and all the children of our church may remain children of God until death. If you are willing to carry out this responsibility, then answer: Yes, as God gives me strength.

C: Yes, as God gives me strength.

M: Let us pray.

We give thanks, most merciful Father, that you have received Axtyn as your own child and made him a member of Christ's body, the church. Now, we pray, grant to him and to all your church on earth that, being dead to sin, we may live to righteousness and, being buried with Christ into his death, we may also share in his resurrection, so that, with all your saints, we may inherit eternal life; through Christ our Lord.

First Reading Job 19:23-27

By faith, Job knew that because the redeemer lives, even though Job would die and his body would decay, he would see his God with his own eyes in the resurrection.

 23"Oh, that my words were recorded, that they were written on a scroll,
 24that they were inscribed with an iron tool on lead, or engraved in rock forever!

²⁵I know that my redeemer lives, and that in the end he will stand on the earth.

²⁶And after my skin has been destroyed, yet in my flesh I will see God;

²⁷I myself will see him with my own eyes—I, and not another. How my heart yearns within me!

M: The Word of the Lord.C: Thanks be to God.

Second Reading

1 Corinthians 15:19-26

Christ gives us hope in this life. But Christ's resurrection gives us hope also for the eternal life that is to come.

¹⁹If only for this life we have hope in Christ, we are of all people most to be pitied.

²⁰But Christ has indeed been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. ²¹For since death came through a man, the resurrection of the dead comes also through a man. ²²For as in Adam all die, so in Christ all will be made alive. ²³But each in turn: Christ, the firstfruits; then, when he comes, those who belong to him. ²⁴Then the end will come, when he hands over the kingdom to God the Father after he has destroyed all dominion, authority and power. ²⁵For he must reign until he has put all his enemies under his feet. ²⁶The last enemy to be destroyed is death.

Gospel Luke 24:1-12

Early Easter morning, angels announce that Christ is not dead, but alive, just as he said it would be.

¹On the first day of the week, very early in the morning, the women took the spices they had prepared and went to the tomb. ²They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, ³but when they entered, they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. ⁴While they were wondering about this, suddenly two men in clothes that gleamed like lightning stood beside them. ⁵In their fright the women bowed down with their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? ⁶He is not here; he has risen! Remember how he told you, while he was still with you in Galilee: ⁷'The Son of Man must be delivered over to the hands of sinners, be crucified and on the third day be raised again.'" ⁸Then they remembered his words.

⁹When they came back from the tomb, they told all these things to the Eleven and to all the others. ¹⁰It was Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the others with them who told this to the apostles. ¹¹But they did not believe the women, because their words seemed to them like nonsense. ¹²Peter, however, got up and ran to the tomb. Bending over, he saw the strips of linen lying by themselves, and he went away, wondering to himself what had happened.

We love to see families worship together, and we welcome children to sing, pray, and grow with us in our services.

We provide a few special worship aids and helps for families:

- Children's bulletins & activity bags are available in the entry, on the wall opposite the sanctuary entrance. Ask an usher if you need help finding them.
- If you or your child needs a quiet space, you can use the fireside room down the hallway across from the restrooms. The service is streamed live on a TV in the room.
 - On Sunday mornings, children of all ages are invited to come to the front of church for the children's message. Parents are welcome, too!
