The Living Lord Completely Changes Our View of Death

THEME OF THE DAY: Most people fear death to some degree. Some fear death because they assume it is the end. Others fear death because they assume it isn't the end at all, but that there will be some sort of reckoning after death that they don't want to face. Perhaps it is understandable then that others would fear death, but believers know by God's promise that death has no lasting claim on us. For God's children death is not discipline but deliverance. Believers understand that death does not cut us down, but only raises us up. With this top-down faith from God we know that Jesus will wake us from death as easily as if he were waking us from an afternoon nap.

Our Worship Series: The phrase "from the top down" often refers to a system where directions, thoughts, and practices flow from management down to others. Where the will and beliefs of those "at the top" are imposed—sometimes aggressively—on those below. Christian teachings come "from the top down," but not that those teachings are oppressively imposed on us. When we call Christianity a "top-down faith," we mean that God tells us things so beautiful and good that they could only have come from him.

Lamentations 3:22-33

God's people were suffering, but the prophet Jeremiah knew that suffering and impending death can focus our attention on what matters: the LORD's compassion and salvation.

²²Because of the LORD's great love we are not consumed, for his compassions never fail.

²³They are new every morning; great is your faithfulness.

²⁴I say to myself, "The LORD is my portion; therefore I will wait for him."

²⁵The LORD is good to those whose hope is in him, to the one who seeks him;

²⁶it is good to wait quietly

for the salvation of the LORD.

²⁷It is good for a man to bear the yoke while he is young.

²⁸Let him sit alone in silence, for the LORD has laid it on him.

²⁹Let him bury his face in the dust there may yet be hope.

³⁰Let him offer his cheek to one who would strike him, and let him be filled with disgrace.

³¹For no one is cast off by the Lord forever.

Though he brings grief, he will show compassion, so great is his unfailing love.

³³For he does not willingly bring affliction or grief to anyone.

Second Reading

2 Corinthians 4:7-15

St. Paul knew that serving Christ might result in death. But he also knew the one who raised Jesus from the dead will also raise us.

⁷But we have this treasure in jars of clay to show that this all-surpassing power is from God and not from us. ⁸We are hard pressed on every side, but not crushed; perplexed, but not in despair; ⁹persecuted, but not abandoned; struck down, but not destroyed. ¹⁰We always carry around in our body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be revealed in our body. ¹¹For we who are alive are always being given over to death for Jesus' sake, so that his life may also be revealed in our mortal body. ¹²So then, death is at work in us, but life is at work in you.

¹³It is written: "I believed; therefore I have spoken." Since we have that same spirit of faith, we also believe and therefore speak, ¹⁴because we know that the one who raised the Lord Jesus from the dead will also raise us with Jesus and present us with you to himself. ¹⁵All this is for your benefit, so that the grace that is reaching more and more people may cause thanksgiving to overflow to the glory of God.

Gospel

Mark 5:21-24a, 35-43

Jesus raises the young daughter of a synagogue leader from the dead as easily as you would wake a sleeping twelve-year old from a nap.

²¹When Jesus had again crossed over by boat to the other side of the lake, a large crowd gathered around him while he was by the lake. ²²Then one of the synagogue leaders, named Jairus, came, and when he saw Jesus, he fell at his feet. ²³He pleaded earnestly with him, "My little daughter is dying. Please come and put your hands on her so that she will be healed and live." ²⁴So Jesus went with him.

³⁵While Jesus was still speaking, some people came from the house of Jairus, the synagogue leader. "Your daughter is dead," they said. "Why bother the teacher anymore?"

³⁶Overhearing what they said, Jesus told him, "Don't be afraid; just believe."

³⁷He did not let anyone follow him except Peter, James and John the brother of James. ³⁸When they came to the home of the synagogue leader, Jesus saw a commotion, with people crying and wailing loudly. ³⁹He went in and said to them, "Why all this commotion and wailing? The child is not dead but asleep." ⁴⁰But they laughed at him.

After he put them all out, he took the child's father and mother and the disciples who were with him, and went in where the child was. ⁴¹He took her by the hand and said to her, "Talitha koum!" (which means "Little girl, I say to you, get up!"). ⁴²Immediately the girl stood up and began to walk around (she was twelve years old). At this they were completely astonished. ⁴³He gave strict orders not to let anyone know about this, and told them to give her something to eat.



"Ministry" is one of those churchy words that is often used, yet perhaps not fully understood. Ministry comes from the Latin word for "service." Ministry involves serving others with love, compassion, and empathy. Helping someone with physical needs is sometimes called "compassion ministry." Helping someone with their spiritual needs, sharing the good news of Christ, is generally called "gospel ministry."

We misunderstand ministry if we think of it as something only ministers do. While pastors are called to perform gospel ministry on behalf of others, ultimately every believer is called by God to reflect Christ-like love and share the message of salvation as God provides those opportunities.

In this worship series we will see our efforts to meet the needs of those God brings into our sphere of influence as meaningful ministry. In our service to them, those people see God's love and God sees our faith. Our worship follows this pattern.
