### Reflections on Repentance: Realizing Our Need for Repentance

Welcome! Thank you for joining us for worship today. In our services we gather before our almighty God to receive his gifts and to offer him our worship and praise. Through God's powerful Word and sacraments he renews our faith and strengthens us to serve in joy.

**PRAYER BEFORE WORSHIP:** Jesus, our Savior and Redeemer, our sins brought your punishment. Our transgressions made your pierced hands necessary. Bless us tonight and throughout the season of Lent as we sincerely repent of our sinful lives and seek to serve you. Amen.

**ASH WEDNESDAY:** This is the first day in the season of Lent, receiving its name from the ancient Christian tradition of receiving ashes to signify inner repentance. This practice finds its roots in the Old Testament, where people would "put on sackcloth and ashes" as a sign of sorrow and mourning. In typical Ash Wednesday observance, Christians are called to the altar during the worship service, and the pastor marks their forehead or hand with ashes in the sign of a cross. As he does this, he quotes Genesis 3:19, saying, "Remember that you are dust and to dust you will return."

The practice of imposing ashes on this day is a visible sign of the true purpose for Ash Wednesday: repentance. As we begin the Lenten journey in observing Jesus' suffering and death, we do so knowing that it was our sins he bore. To prepare ourselves to see our Savior shed his blood, we spend time, especially today, in godly sorrow over our sins and all we have done wrong. We remember that the wages of our sin is death, and that one day we will return to the dust from which our race was made. In such sorrow and repentance, we then are properly prepared to see how Jesus has paid for our sins by giving his life on the cross.

A WORD ABOUT HOLY COMMUNION: Our church observes the biblical practice of member communion (also called close communion). In Holy Communion we not only receive forgiveness from God, but we also express the unique relationship our members have with each other. If you are not a member of our congregation, we kindly ask that you not take communion today, but speak with our pastor after the service. We would love to share the sacrament with you in the future.

# **Order of Worship**



Reading Psalm 51

Have mercy on me, O God, according to your unfailing love; according to your great compassion blot out my transgressions.

The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit; a broken and contrite heart, O God, you will not despise.

In your good pleasure make Zion prosper; build up the walls of Jerusalem.

Then there will be righteous sacrifices, whole burnt offerings to delight you; then bulls will be offered on your altar.

### **GATHERING RITE FOR LENT**

- M: Brothers and sisters in Christ, God created us to know perfect peace with him, to love all humanity, and to live in harmony with all creation. But sin separates us from God, our neighbors, and creation, and so we do not enjoy the life our Creator intended for us. By our sin we grieve our Father, who does not desire us to come under his judgment but to hear him and live. Therefore, God in his mercy has sent our Lord Jesus Christ to take our place under the law, to suffer for us, and to take the punishment of death that we deserve. God made Jesus, "who had no sin, to be sin for us so that in him, we might become the right-eousness of God." (2 Corinthians 5:21)
- M: During the 40 days of Lent, "we fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy set before him endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of God." (Hebrews 12:2) The time of Lent reminds us that "to know Christ and the power of his resurrection, we must also know the fellowship of sharing in his sufferings, becoming like him in his death." (Philippians 3:10) As disciples of the Lord Jesus, we are called to struggle against everything that leads us away from love of God and neighbor.

I invite you, therefore, to confess your sins, ask our Father for forgiveness, and commit yourselves to this struggle against sin.

- M: Most holy and merciful Father,
- C: I confess to you and to my brothers and sisters that I have sinned in thought, word, and deed, by what I have done and by what I have left undone.
- M: Most holy and merciful Father,
- C: we confess to you and to one another that we have sinned by our own fault, by our own grievous fault. In thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone.
- M: We have not loved you with our whole heart and mind and strength. We have not loved our neighbors as ourselves.
  - We have not forgiven others as we have been forgiven.
- C: Have mercy on us, Lord.
- M: We have been deaf to your call to serve as Christ served us.

  We have not been true to the mind of Christ. We have grieved the Holy Spirit.
- C: Have mercy on us, Lord.
- M: We have placed our wants before your will.

We have gratified the desires of our sinful nature.

We have merited your punishment now and forever.

C: Have mercy on us, Lord.

- M: We confess to you, Lord, all our past unfaithfulness. The pride, hypocrisy, and impatience in our lives.
- C: We confess to you, O Lord.
- M: Our self-indulgent appetites and ways, our manipulation of other people, our anger when our selfish aims are denied, and our envy of those more fortunate than ourselves.
- C: We confess to you, O Lord.
- M: Our love of worldly goods and comforts, and our dishonesty in daily life and work,

our negligence in worship and prayer, and our failure to show the faith that is in us.

- C: We confess to you, O Lord.
- M: Forgive us, Lord, for the wrongs we have done. For our blindness to human need and suffering and our indifference to injustice and cruelty,
- C: Forgive us, Lord.
- M: For all false judgments, for uncharitable thoughts toward others, and for our prejudice and contempt for those who differ from us,
- C: Forgive us, Lord.
- M: For what we think or say or do that is at variance with your will,
- C: Forgive us, Lord.
- M: Restore us, good Lord, and let your anger depart from us.
- C: Hear us, Lord, for your mercy is great.

### Imposition of Ashes

Those who desire to receive the sign of ashes come forward a the direction of the ushers. Parents may bring their children forward at their discretion. If you would like to receive the ashes on the back of your hand instead of your forehead, please hold out your hand. Once you receive the ashes please return to your seat.

The pastor or attendant applies the ashes to the forehead or hand in the form of a small cross, saying,

M: Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return.

After all who desire have received ashes, the minister says:

M: Accomplish in us, O God, the work of your salvation

C: That we may show forth your glory in the world.

M: By the cross and suffering of your Son, O Lord,

C: Bring us with all your saints to the joy of his resurrection.

#### **Absolution**

M: The almighty God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, does not desire the death of sinners but rather that they turn from their wickedness and live. Therefore, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son + and of the Holy Spirit. During these days of Lent, let us implore God to give us renewal and his Holy Spirit. May we continue to abide in the true faith and at the last be received by him only through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ our Lord.

# **Scripture Reading**

2 Samuel 12:1-13

The Lord sends the prophet Nathan to call King David to repentance. Nathan lowers David's defenses by telling the king a story about an immoral rich man.

<sup>1</sup>The LORD sent Nathan to David. When he came to him, he said, "There were two men in a certain town, one rich and the other poor. <sup>2</sup>The rich man had a very large number of sheep and cattle, <sup>3</sup>but the poor man had nothing except one little ewe lamb he had bought. He raised it, and it grew up with him and his children. It shared his food, drank from his cup and even slept in his arms. It was like a daughter to him.

<sup>4</sup>"Now a traveler came to the rich man, but the rich man refrained from taking one of his own sheep or cattle to prepare a meal for the traveler who had come to him. Instead, he took the ewe lamb that belonged to the poor man and prepared it for the one who had come to him."

<sup>5</sup>David burned with anger against the man and said to Nathan, "As surely as the LORD lives, the man who did this must die! <sup>6</sup>He must pay for that lamb four times over, because he did such a thing and had no pity."

<sup>7</sup>Then Nathan said to David, "You are the man! This is what the LORD, the God of Israel, says: 'I anointed you king over Israel, and I delivered you from the hand of Saul. <sup>8</sup>I gave your master's house to you, and your master's wives into your arms. I gave you all Israel and Judah. And if all this had been too little, I would have given you even more. <sup>9</sup>Why did you despise the word of the LORD by doing what is evil in his eyes? You struck down Uriah the Hittite with the sword and took his wife to be your own. You killed him with the sword of the Ammonites. <sup>10</sup>Now, therefore, the sword will never depart from your house, because you despised me and took the wife of Uriah the Hittite to be your own.'

<sup>11</sup>"This is what the LORD says: 'Out of your own household I am going to bring calamity on you. Before your very eyes I will take your wives and give them to one who is close to you, and he will sleep with your wives in broad daylight. <sup>12</sup>You did it in secret, but I will do this thing in broad daylight before all Israel.'"

<sup>13</sup>Then David said to Nathan, "I have sinned against the LORD."

Nathan replied, "The LORD has taken away your sin. You are not going to die.

Gospel Luke 12:13-21

To lower the defenses of those who were self-righteous, Jesus tells a parable about what makes us righteous in God's eyes—trusting in God's great mercy.

<sup>9</sup>To some who were confident of their own righteousness and looked down on everyone else, Jesus told this parable: <sup>10</sup>"Two men went up to the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. <sup>11</sup>The Pharisee stood by himself and prayed: 'God, I thank you that I am not like other people—robbers, evildoers, adulterers—or even like this tax collector. <sup>12</sup>I fast twice a week and give a tenth of all I get.'

<sup>13</sup>"But the tax collector stood at a distance. He would not even look up to heaven, but beat his breast and said, 'God, have mercy on me, a sinner.'






# **Words of Institution**




