





Salem Saints—50 years of God's grace

In keeping with our Lord's command, *"Let the little children come unto me,"* Salem Lutheran Church established a Christian Day School— originally referred to as the "German School"—

in 1882, the same year the congregation was founded. At that time, the church was located at 4th and Oak Streets in Stillwater, and classes were held in the church basement.

The first mention of the school appears in the parish notes dated September 12, 1882. Classes were held four days a week, with a tuition of fifty cents per student per month, a common practice among Lutheran schools of that era. By April 1899, enrollment had reached 85 students.

Emil Reim served as the first teacher from 1883 to 1892, followed by Louis Huber until 1899, when Salem's building was destroyed by fire. On the day the rebuilt church was rededicated, a new teacher, John Gieschen, was installed. During Pastor Pieper's ministry, he also assisted in teaching.

In 1916, the school adapted to the public school grading system, but due to economic decline—marked by the closure of sawmills and factories—many families left Stillwater. As a result, Salem's school closed in May 1919, with congregational records referring to it as a "temporary" closure. From 1919 to 1974, children were served through Sunday School, Vacation Bible School, Released-Time classes, and catechism instruction.

Nearly 55 years later, in 1973, the congregation revisited the idea of reopening the school. A committee was formed in January, a school fund was established in

October, and at the January 1974 congregational meeting, the decision was made to reopen Salem Lutheran School in the fall.

After two initial calls were returned, Miss Bonnie Voth accepted the call to teach grades 1–6, and Mrs. Charles Kurth served as the kindergarten teacher. Salem's school reopened in September 1974, once again proclaiming the peace of Christ to his lambs. As enrollment grew, the congregation constructed a new school building, dedicated in 1979. During construction, classes were held in various parts of the church, including the overflow area and subdivided fellowship hall.

To further serve the needs of families, Salem Lutheran Preschool opened in the fall of 1990 with Sue Geske and Cheryl Raleigh as its first teachers. Continued growth led to a major school expansion completed in 1995, providing additional classroom space and updated facilities.

In 1990, the school adopted a new identity: the mascot was changed from the Loggers to the Saints, and new school colors were introduced to foster unity and school spirit. Staff additions in the following years, including Debbie Hansen (1998) and Jane Grobe (2001), helped support the school's expanding ministry.

Now, more than 140 years after its founding and over 50 years since its reopening, Salem Lutheran School remains committed to providing a Christ-centered education, serving students and families with faith, excellence, and love.
