Lutheran Identity

Salem Lutheran Church believes strongly in the ministry to support families with Christian education. Our identity as a Lutheran School is of primary importance. Teachers are role models of living a faith filled life. Their faith impacts their interactions and instruction with the students. Our school day starts with the study of God's Word. Before lunch we pray and give thanks to God for all the blessings we receive. After lunch, we join in a short study of God's Word through devotions and we end each day with prayer before we go home. In addition, the teachers incorporate God's Word into all subjects when applicable. The cost to provide this Christ-Centered education is \$7,500 per student each year. The church financially supports this ministry to keep tuition costs reasonable for each family.

Objectives

In keeping with Salem Lutheran School's mission statement and philosophy, the objectives of the school are:

- 1. to assist parents in the Christian training of their children
- 2. to nurture and strengthen the faith of each child
- 3. to cultivate in the children a positive self-image as redeemed children of God

- 6. to give children an opportunity to live their faith in daily Christian fellowship

- 8. to encourage children to live as obedient citizens of their country
- 9. to strengthen the congregation and the church-at-large through the training of its future members.

Test Scores



Shown on the left are the overall averages for Salem in our MAP test scoring for the Spring Testing Period. We are above the 50th percentile for all three subject areas. The goal for these tests is to continue to see growth within the students. We want all students to score as high as they can, but if they are continuing to grow from where they were at the beginning of the year, that is the most important aspect of testing.

Strategic Plan Update

As a member of the Minnesota Nonpublic School Accrediting Association (MNSAA), we must report on how we are progressing towards our goal in our strategic plan. Below are the initiatives for this school year as well as what has been done to achieve these goals:

Goal #1: Review Communication Apps to Use and Adapt to Best Serve our Families

Salem's faculty took the second half of the school year to look into various communication apps that we could use at Salem. Early in the fall a survey was sent out to gauge how our parents felt about ClassDojo, the current app we use. The response was very positive with 92% liking the app. The faculty looked into ClassDojo to make sure we are using it to its fullest capacities. We also had a meeting with Bloomz and had a good experience with them as well. In the end, the faculty decided to stick with ClassDojo for the time being with many changes already anticipated for next school year. Bloomz may be something we look into in the future, but ClassDojo has everything we need to function well as a school.

Goal #2: Implement Amplify Reading Curriculum

Last year, the faculty decided to go with the Amplify Reading Curriculum, which makes this year the first year of implementation. The teachers have been adjusting to the new curriculum and have been enjoying the pacing and learning targets that Amplify offers. It meets the students where they at an appropriate level, but also pushes them in their knowledge, writing, and reading abilities. We are excited to continue to track the student's progress as we have more and more years with this curriculum.

Goal #3: Use MAP Testing Data to Inform Teaching and Update Parents

The MAP Testing review in-service days have been a great addition to our faculty. We now have a day to dive into the results and talk as a group about our curriculum and how we can work together to continue to make it better. Through this process, we have found some blind spots that we weren't aware of and have added some supplementary material to cover concepts that are vital to the education of our Salem students. The faculty will also be participating in some new professional development that MAP Testing is putting out which should help us continue to dive into the data the students give us.
