# Imminent Arrival of My Lord and My God

Welcome! Thank you for joining us for worship today. In our services we gather before our almighty God to receive his gifts and to offer him our worship and praise. Through God's powerful Word and sacraments he renews our faith and strengthens us to serve in joy.

**PRAYER BEFORE WORSHIP:** Blessed Spirit, as we gather for worship once again in your house we praise you for promises given and promises kept. **THEME OF THE DAY:** December 21 is the Festival of St. Thomas, Apostle. According to church tradition, it is the day he died a martyr's death while doing mission work in India. On Easter evening, Thomas was absent when Jesus appeared to the other disciples, and he famously refused to believe that Jesus had risen from the dead until he could see and touch Jesus' wounds. After seeing the risen Jesus a week later, Thomas cried out, "My Lord and my God!"

There are still skeptics today who think that Jesus' virgin birth or resurrection from the dead are myths. It is appropriate to invite those skeptics to find out what the Bible says about those events. The Holy Spirit can work on their hearts just like he did with Thomas.

WORSHIP SERIES: Do you remember the feeling when someone important is about to arrive at your place? It's a mixture of anticipation and excitement and nervousness. During these weeks before Christmas, we anticipate the imminent arrival of Jesus. He's an important person! We are about to celebrate his birth. He could return on judgment day at any time. But in worship we realize that he impacts our lives when the Bible is read and when the sacraments are administered. Suddenly we feel the excitement of an imminent arrival.

# First Reading

Judges 6:36-40

Gideon asks for proof that God would keep his promises.

<sup>36</sup>Gideon said to God, "If you will save Israel by my hand as you have promised— <sup>37</sup>look, I will place a wool fleece on the threshing floor. If there is dew only on the fleece and all the ground is dry, then I will know that you will save Israel by my hand, as you said." <sup>38</sup>And that is what happened. Gideon rose early the next day; he squeezed the fleece and wrung out the dew—a bowlful of water.

<sup>39</sup>Then Gideon said to God, "Do not be angry with me. Let me make just one more request. Allow me one more test with the fleece, but this time make the fleece dry and let the ground be covered with dew." <sup>40</sup>That night God did so. Only the fleece was dry; all the ground was covered with dew.

<sup>39</sup>But we do not belong to those who shrink back and are destroyed, but to those who have faith and are saved. <sup>1</sup>Now faith is confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we do not see.

Reach out your hand and put it into my side. Stop doubting and believe." <sup>28</sup>Thomas said to him, "My Lord and my God!"


<sup>29</sup>Then Jesus told him, "Because you have seen me, you have believed; blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed."


