Romans 4:1-5, 13-17

GETTING TO KNOW EACH OTHER

The Jews often bragged if they could trace their lineage back to Abraham. How far back can you trace your lineage? Is there anyone in your family tree that is notable in history?

INTO THE WORD

Verse 2 says Abraham had reason to boast compared to those living around him (but not before God). What could he have boasted about?

What does Paul argue is the difference between earning righteousness through works and receiving it through faith? (verses 2-3) How is “credited” righteousness different from a wage?

Read verses 6-8. Why does Paul bring up King David here, and what does David’s life choices teach about forgiveness and the “blessedness” of a person?

Read verses 9-10. Why does Paul bring up circumcision here, and why does it matter that Abraham was declared righteous by God before he was circumcised?

In what areas of your life are you tempted to rely on “works (your behavior, reputation, or service to others) rather than faith to feel right with God?

Since justification is a gift rather than a wage, how will that change how you approach God in prayer and worship this week?
